North Dakota administers CSBG to

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CSBG Performance Outcomes for North Dakota

Below is a subset of the outcomes achieved by the ND CSBG Network including 45,032 indicators of movement toward self-sufficiency and community revitalization.

Outcomes achieved include:	
4,928	Employment or Work Supports Low-income participants in CSBG Network employment initiatives obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to initial or continuous employment, acquired a job, obtained an increase in employment income, or achieved "living wage" employment and benefits.
1,172	Economic Asset Enhancement and Utilization Low-income households achieved an increase in financial assets or financial skills as a result of CSBG Network assistance.
9,260	Child and Family Development Infants, children, youth, parents, and other adults participated in developmental or enrichment programs facilitated by the CSBG Network and achieved program goals.
5,532	Independent Living for Low-Income Vulnerable Populations Low-income vulnerable individuals received services from the CSBG Network and secured or maintained an independent living situation as a result.
8,265	Family Stability Low-income participants obtained supports which reduced or eliminated barriers to family stability through assistance from the CSBG Network.
12,493	Emergency Assistance Low-income individuals and families received emergency assistance from the CSBG Network.
2,077	Community Opportunities and Resources Community opportunities or resources were improved or expanded for low-income people as a result of CSBG Network projects or initiatives, or advocacy with other public and private agencies.
1,305	Community Empowerment Community members and low-income people mobilized to engage in activities that support and promote their own well-being and that of their community as a direct result of CSBG Network initiatives through maximum feasible participation.
